

MASTER'S DEGREE IN INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY PROGRAMME (MIP) 2025 INTAKE



Applications are invited from suitably qualified candidates for admission into the Master in Intellectual Property (MIP) Programme. The MIP Programme is jointly offered by Africa University (AU); the World Intellectual Property Organization (WIPO) Academy and the African Regional Intellectual Property Organization (ARIPO) with financial support from the Government of Japan. The Programme adopts a blended teaching and comparative approach, with particular emphasis on Africa. Lectures are delivered by renowned academics, intellectual property professionals, IP officers, and other experts from Africa, Europe, and beyond.

STRUCTURE OF THE MIP PROGRAMME

The duration of the programme is 12 months.

Part I: Distance Learning Phase

Students take three WIPO Distance Learning (DL) courses offered online from May to July 2025. At the end of the DL courses, examinations are written.

Online classes facilitated by the WIPO Academy are scheduled from 1 May 2025 to 29 July 2025;

Part II: Residential Learning Phase

The Residential Learning Phase for the 2025 intake is expected to start on 1 August 2025 and expected to end on 6 December 2025.

During this phase, students take residential courses at Africa University in Mutare, Zimbabwe, attending face to face lectures with professors/lecturers and IP experts. Class teaching is complemented by case studies, tutorials, research work, field trips, dissertation proposal writing and defence. A total of 6 examinable modules are taken during this phase of study.

In the last two weeks of the Residential Learning Phase, students go through practical training and participate in an Intellectual Property Conference at ARIPO in Harare, Zimbabwe.

Part III: Dissertation Writing Phase

Students work on their dissertations on selected and approved topics between January and April 2026. Every student works intensively under the guidance of two supervisors who are allocated during the Residential Learning Phase.

Dissertation writing starts during the residential phase with proposal writing and defence. Fieldwork and related process are expected to start in December 2025 and end on 30 April 2026.





ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

1. A minimum of a Bachelor's degree in a Second Class Lower division or better from a recognised academic institution;
2. At least two years of post-qualification experience;
3. 5 'O' Level passes at Grade 'C' or better or equivalent including English Language;
4. A copy of a detailed Curriculum Vitae (CV);
5. At least two reference letters;
6. An autobiographical statement of not more than 1 500 words giving a description of your activities and experience, relating them to your career objectives. Applicants are required to indicate the importance of the MIP to their career goals.

Degree Award

Upon successful completion of the programme, participants would be awarded the Master in Intellectual Property Degree (MIP) by Africa University on behalf of WIPO and ARIPO.

Fees and Costs

For tuition, accommodation, registration and other costs send your inquiries to studentrecruitment@africau.edu. Subsistence and upkeep costs are estimated at \$350 per month per candidate. It is the university policy that accommodation and subsistence fees are paid in advance for all students in university residence. It must be noted that the fees and other charges are subject to change.

Scholarships

With a view to contribute to more human resources with intellectual property expertise in the African continent, WIPO, ARIPO and the Government of Japan offer scholarships to approximately 30 qualified students. The scholarship covers an economy class return ticket, board and lodging at Africa University and ARIPO, tuition, registration and medical insurance.
